
Jones Island Marine State Park

Without question one of the more popular destinations of the San Juan Islands.

Take a walk along the 2 miles of hiking trails and you may see deer, birds, or mink, or search for the foundation of a pioneer's homesite on the south side of the island. The cove and dock on the north side of the island are a short walk away.

Natural History:

Jones Island was named by the Wilkes Expedition in 1941 in honor of Cpt. Jacob Jones, US Navy, who captured the British brig "Frolic" on October 18, 1812, as Master Commandant of the sloop-of-war "Wasp." The island has denser vegetation than the other islands, and island deer have become so tame that they regularly beg food from campers.
